Instructions

In your 3rd semester, work with your advisor to identify completed and planned courses to fulfill department requirements. Write the course number, name, and semester completed or to be completed for each course. If you have an approved transfer course that fulfills a listed required course (JTC 500, 501), type in the transfer course next to the JTC version you are replacing. This form will also help you fill out the GS6 form on RamWeb before you register for your 4th semester.

Required Core. The fundamental theory, methods, and research credits required for all students.

JMC Graduate Core. All JMC graduate courses level 500 and above.

Electives. Courses outside or inside JMC can count as electives. These may be undergraduate courses at level 300 or higher, or they may be graduate level courses at level 500+.

Credit Rules

- 31 credits total required for the master's degree
- At least 24 credits must be earned at CSU, with 21 earned after admission to the MS program
- At least 16 credits must be level 500+
- MS students cannot get credit toward the degree for JTC 684 (Supervised College Teaching)
